5. Executive Reports:

A) Chair Report: Kelsey Ohs presented

i) Welcome: It has been an honour and a privilege to serve as Chair of the PAC the past two years at Watson.

ii) Please see Appendix 1 - School Year in Review 2024/2025

iii) Chair's recommendations for the 2025/2026 school year:

• Volunteer Sign-Up - at the beginning of the year to obtain contact information from willing guardians. Early sign-ups help PAC plan better and match interests and

availability to upcoming PAC events and needs—like hot lunches, Christmas hampers, fundraising, school events, photocopying and more.

- Further communication around filling specific event needs. Did you know? Our PAC runs a Christmas Hamper Program to support local families in need during the holiday season. With your help, we provide food and essentials to brighten the holidays for others in our school community. You can help by donating money, purchasing specific items or volunteering to help shop or pack!
- Revise Easter/Spring fundraisers For the 2025/2026 school year, we will not be offering a Spring Purdy's Chocolate order. New fundraising suggestions are always welcome.
- Installation of Semi-permanent backdrops for concerts / stage Traditionally, the PAC allocates a portion of its budget each year to create a new backdrop for the Winter Concert. While these one-time-use displays have added seasonal charm, they require significant effort and funding annually.
 - Suggestion:

To reduce costs and preparation time in future years, we propose investing in a semi-permanent, free-standing backdrop system that can be reused for multiple events, including the Winter Concert, Spring Concert, and other school performances.

- Facebook clean up The PAC will be conducting a year-end clean-up of the parent Facebook group to ensure it remains a secure and relevant communication space for current families of Watson. This process helps protect privacy, maintain an engaged group, and streamline communication.
- Athletic Jerseys This year, the PAC funded the purchase of 24 reversible, school logobranded jerseys to support school team sports and events. To better accommodate a wider range of student sizes, we plan to purchase a few additional jerseys in various adult sizes (S, M, L). This will ensure inclusivity and proper fit for all participants.
- Constitution and Bylaws Review Update Needed
 - The Watson Elementary PAC Constitution and Bylaws are due for an update to ensure they reflect current roles, responsibilities, and practices. Specific areas requiring revision include:
 - Addition of a District Parent Association Council (DPAC) Representative executive position description; and
 - Revision to the timelines and duties of elected officials, which no longer accurately reflect current responsibilities and PAC operations. We move to change in accordance with the governing BCCPAC Constitution and Bylaws.
 - Proposed amendments to the Watson PAC Constitution and Bylaws will be distributed via email to all members for review. Members will have the opportunity to provide feedback before the amendments are presented for approval at the June 10 General PAC meeting.

B) Co-Chair / Hot Lunch Report: Kele Nash presented

i) 2024-2025 Donation Report – Please see Appendix 2

- A donation option was added to MunchaLunch this year, allowing families to contribute in \$2, \$5, and \$10 amounts. This initiative was well-received and raised a total of \$1,232.
- \$978 of the funds were used to support novelty hot lunches for students in need.
- The remaining \$254 will be allocated in collaboration with school administration, the CYC (Child and Youth Care worker), and the Indigenous Education Assistant to support additional student needs.
- This program has provided meaningful assistance to ensure all students can participate in novelty lunch events and will continue to be refined based on community needs.
- ii) Tin Lizzy Donut Truck Novelty Treat Day / Fundraising Event
 - On Friday, May 9, we hosted the Tin Lizzy Donut Truck for a fun and delicious fundraising event. Pre-orders were available through MunchaLunch, and the event also featured afternoon walk-up sales after school. Tin Lizzy was highly recommended by other schools, and we're pleased to report that they were a fantastic partner.
 - From walk-up sales alone, the PAC earned a profit of \$210, which has been added to our fundraising efforts.
 - Thank you to everyone who participated and helped make the event a sweet success!

iii) Kona Ice Fundraiser – Monday, June 23 after school

- On Monday, June 23, Kona Ice will be visiting after school for a fun year-end treat!
- This will be a walk-up sale, with cash, credit, and debit accepted.
- 10% of all sales will be donated back to the PAC to support future school initiatives.
- It's a great way to celebrate the end of the school year and cool down with a treat. Thank you for supporting the PAC!

C) Treasurer's Report: Justin Nearing presented

i) Treasurers Report - Please see Appendix 3 April 2025 Report

• We have approximately \$20 left in the Gaming Grant that must be used before the end of the year. *A suggestion for next year is to purchase "Watson Stickers" for school events.

D) Grade 5 Fundraising: Jaime Vieira presented

i) Grade 5 Camp – Camp Squeah

- The Grade 5 year-end camping trip to Camp Squeah is scheduled for Monday, May 26 to Tuesday, May 27.
- The students have had a successful year of fundraising, beginning in the fall with freezie sales and continuing with other initiatives throughout the year.
- The initial cost of the camp was \$225 per student, but thanks to their efforts, the cost has been reduced to approximately \$150 per camper. This reduction has helped make the trip more accessible for families and is a great example of student initiative and community support.
- Weekly Freezie Sale profits have ranged from \$225 to \$350

ii) Grade 5 Continuation Celebration – Update

- This year's Grade 5 Continuation Celebration will take a slightly different format to better support student well-being and inclusivity.
- There will be no formal stage presentation, in response to feedback and increased awareness of student anxiety around public performance. Instead, the Rotary Club will host a BBQ for Grade 5 students on Wednesday, June 25, for approximately 2 hours.

PAC Contribution:

- PAC will provide cupcakes, including gluten-free options;
- PAC will provide condiments (Ketchup & Mustard) packets for students; and
- PAC will provide access to PAC Kitchen fridges for Rotary to use for perishables.

This event supports a positive send-off for Grade 5 students while promoting community connection and student comfort.

a) Vision Screening – Knight Road Legacy. A Welch Allyn Spot Vision Screener has been purchased by The Mount Cheam Lions Charitable Society for use in Chilliwack Schools. As part of this ongoing initiative, members of the Mount Cheam Lions Club and Steller's Jay Lions Club have been conducting vision screenings for students in Kindergarten to Grade 5 across the district. Approximately 15% of the children screened have been identified with previously undiagnosed vision problems, highlighting the importance and impact of this program. **b) Bike Swap – Community Event** – Mary Glasgow Brown presented The PAC will be hosting a Bike Swap on Saturday, June 7th in the Watson Elementary parking lot.
